disorders by focusing on their abilities to live, work, learn and fully participate and contribute to our society, but also enriches the culture of

our community life; and

WHEREAS. the Oakland Community Health Network (OCHN), and its service

provider agencies, are committed to inspiring hope, empowering people,

and strengthening communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, Oakland Community Health Network, hereby recognizes May 2021 as Mental Health Awareness Month.
